Increase Home-Based Child Care Slots Via Targeted Start-Up Grants

Policy Snapshot: Create up to 6,000 new home-based child care slots through targeted start-up grants — providing Utah families with affordable, flexible, & safe child care options.

The Problem

77% of Utahns live in a **child care desert**, where there are not enough licensed child care options to meet the needs of working families.

This is especially true in rural counties — Daggett, Piute, Rich and Wayne have no licensed child care providers at all.

Home-based providers are an important source of affordable, flexible, and accessible care — especially critical in rural Utah and other child care deserts.

The Solution: Boost Supply of Quality Home-Based Child Care

- 1 Establish a \$2.3 million grant pool to support the launch of approximately 1,000 new home-based child care providers, with individual grants of up to \$5,000 each.

Note: Funding would support stay-at-home parents seeking a family-friendly income and incentivize slots in child care deserts, care during nights and weekends, & providers enrolled in the Quality Rating System.

- 2 Increase the maximum number of children for unlicensed home-based providers from 8 to 10.
- 3 Require registration for home-based providers caring for 4 to 10 children — ensuring background checks, CPR training, and mandated abuse reporting.

The Potential Impact

Hundreds of home-based providers supported

6,000 new child care slots created



Funding: \$2.5 million one-time appropriation
