### HIGHLIGHTS:

#### **Federal Grant Applications Requiring Legislative Action**

Twelve grants, totaling \$17,956,658 require approval from the Executive Appropriations Committee. These grants require an additional \$1,760,220 of state matching funding, which will be covered by existing program funds. One grant is new and eleven are previously approved grants needing supplemental spending authority.
