(for up to 10 years)

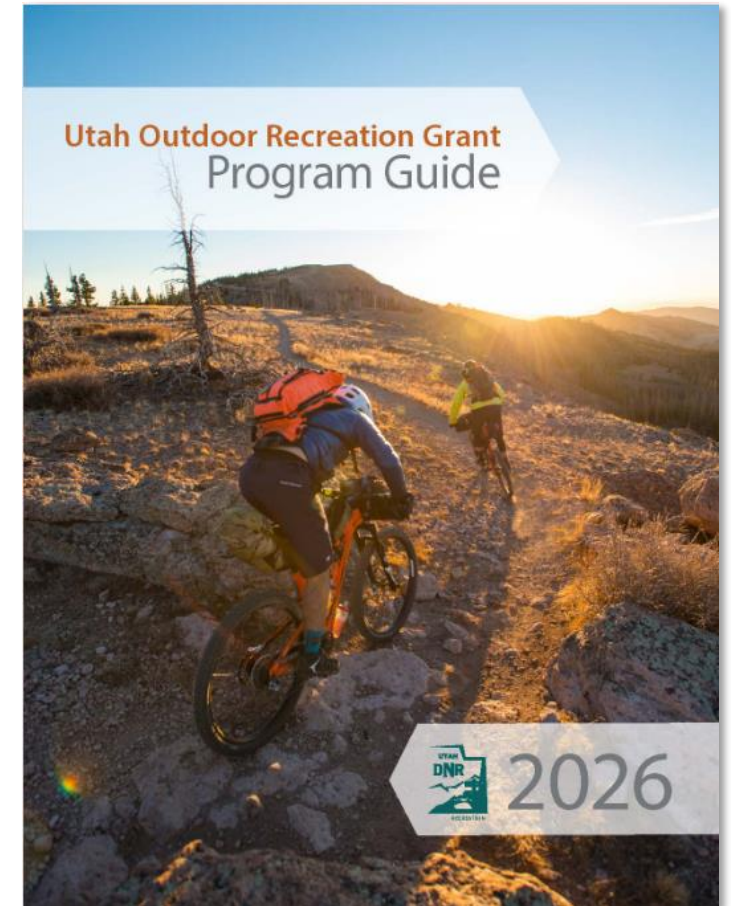
B. Reauthorize + make changes

Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Grant Program

- Administered by the Division of Outdoor Recreation to enhance and promote public outdoor recreation statewide, with a focus on infrastructure
- The division sets application, eligibility, funding, and reporting requirements in consultation with an advisory committee
- Legislative history highlights:
 - Created in [2016](#) (\$1,000,000 appropriated from General Fund)
 - For-profit entities excluded from eligibility in [2023](#)



Utah Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Advisory Committee

- 17 members:
 - Director of the Division of Outdoor Recreation (DOR)
 - Director of the Division of State Parks
 - 15 members appointed by the executive director of DNR
- Advises and makes recommendations to DOR on:
 - Nonmotorized recreational trails & related grants
 - Recreation Restoration Infrastructure Grant Program
 - Utah Children’s Outdoor Recreation and Education (UCORE) Grant Program
 - Outdoor Recreational Infrastructure Grant Program
- Legislative history highlights:
 - Created in 2022 – Sunset date added at creation
 - Amended in 2025 to remove reference to an unfunded account



Great Salt Lake Advisory Council

- 11 members appointed by governor with advice/consent of Senate
- Examples of powers and duties
 - Advises governor, DNR, DEQ, and GSL Commissioner + Assists
 - Interacts with GSL technical team
 - Reports to NRAEQ Appropriations Subcommittee
 - Directs expenditure of \$125,000
 - Functions as GSL Watershed Council
- Legislative history highlights:
 - Created in 2010
 - Sunset date added in 2020



Resource Development Coordinating Committee

- 26 members:
 - State science advisor
 - Representatives of state executive departments (6) and divisions (18)
 - Representative of the School & Institutional Trust Lands Administration
- Assists the Public Lands Policy Coordinating Office (PLPCO):
 - Review proposed state actions and certain federal actions affecting physical resources
 - Review proposed federal regulation and policies related to natural resources
 - Develop and implement a procedure to expedite review of proposed energy and industrial facilities requiring multiple permits
- Legislative history highlights:
 - Created in 1981 (previously established by executive order)
 - Moved to PLPCO from the Office of Management and Budget in 2021
