

State Historic Preservation Office

State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) oversees archaeological and historic buildings programs for the State of Utah

SHPO receives federal grants from the National Park Service to manage legal compliance programs, etc.

National Register Review Committee

- Required by the National Park Service for the State Historic Preservation Office mandated duties
- Composition of Committee is partially defined by the National Park Service for subject matter experts (archaeology, architecture, architectural history, history, geography, planning, public, etc.)

National Register Review Committee



Critical Duty of Review Committee:

- Review and provide comments on National Register of Historic Places Nominations
- Meets three times per year
- Reviews anywhere between five and eight nominations per meeting.
- Nominations are community-driven or individual property owner.
