Legislative Interim Meetings

Meetings were held August 19, 2026, or as noted

Business and Labor

Draft Legislation: Alarm System and Security Licensing Advisory Board Amendments

Discussed 2027 General Session draft legislation, "[Alarm System and Security Licensing Advisory Board Amendments](#)," which would extend the sunset date of the Alarm System and Security Licensing Advisory Board by 10 years.

Action: Adopted 2027 General Session draft legislation, "Alarm System and Security Licensing Advisory Board Amendments," as a committee bill and recommended the bill for inclusion in a potential omnibus sunset bill.

Draft Legislation: Workers' Compensation Advisory Council Amendments

Discussed 2027 General Session draft legislation, "[Workers' Compensation Advisory Council Amendments](#)," which would extend the sunset date of the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council by 10 years.

Action: Adopted 2027 General Session draft legislation, "Workers' Compensation Advisory Council Amendments," as a committee bill and recommended the bill for inclusion in a potential omnibus sunset bill.

Employment Non-Competition Clauses

Received presentations from [committee staff](#) and [stakeholders](#) representing employers and employees on post-employment non-competition clauses. Discussed legislative history and policy, the current status of non-compete regulation, and employer and employee perspectives on effectiveness, appropriateness, and merits of the use of non-competition clauses.

Action: Directed committee staff to prepare research and policy options regarding non-compete regulation.

Office of Professional Licensure Review

Recommendations

Received a [presentation](#) from the Office of Professional Licensure Review and discussed recommendations from its annual review of medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, and allied health professions.

Property Management Oversight

Received a [presentation](#) from the Department of Commerce on the statutory report required under [Utah Code Section 13-1-19](#). Received recommendations regarding property managers and the jurisdiction of the Division of Consumer Protection and the Division of Real Estate.

Action: Opened a committee bill file to address concerns related to renter property management.

Real Estate Wire Fraud

Received a [presentation](#) from a legislator and stakeholders about the real estate purchase process to identify the primary causes of wire fraud. Discussed vulnerabilities in communication methods, and considered potential legislative action to decrease the risk of data leaks, identity theft, and wire fraud.

Federal Guidance Letters Update

Heard from commission staff regarding [federal guidance letters](#) received during the 2026 calendar year. 2026 General Session S.B. 100, [Federalism Revisions](#), requires state agencies to post federal guidance letters received to the state public notice website. Agencies are required to provide:

- a link to the letter;
- a description of what the letter addresses;
- how the letter could impact Utah and its citizens; and
- a recommendation to the commission whether the letter violates the principles of federalism.

General Federalism Issues

Heard from representatives of Utah's federal delegation regarding issues at the federal level that might be of interest to the Federalism Commission.

National Federalism Initiative

Received an update on National Federalism Initiative efforts, including:

- education;
- outreach to other states;
- a future federalism summit;
- sending a [letter](#) to the federal government regarding the location of an Immigration and Customs Enforcement Facility in Utah; and
- developing law enforcement protocols.

Public Lands Amendments

***Action:** Opened a bill file to address issues relating to the management of public lands in Utah, the Public Lands Policy Coordinating Office, and the State Resource Management Plan.*

August 20, 2026

General Federalism Issues

Heard from Utah's federal delegation representatives on issues being addressed in the federal government that could infringe upon state jurisdictional powers.

Immigration and Customs Enforcement

Discussed a letter that the commission sent to the federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement on the process of locating a facility in Utah.

National Federalism Initiative

Heard from legislators and commissioners who participated in the National Federalism Initiative (NFI) summit. The NFI summit is focused on three areas for next year:

- addressing the 10th amendment and who should govern;
- defining what capacity states have to assume more governing responsibility; and

- identifying what limits and protections can we rely on to ensure and maintain civil liberties.

Public Lands Issues

Heard from a legislator, the state forester, county commissioners, and citizens impacted by wildfires and federal management of public lands. Discussed the impact of mismanaged public lands on the number and size of wildfires in Utah and the impact of wildfires on air quality, wildlife, watersheds, and flooding.

Public Lands Policy Coordinating Office Update

Heard from the Public Lands Policy Coordinating Office regarding federal land use designations and coordination with federal agencies. Federal lands designations over the past 50 years have resulted in significant increased restrictions on the use of public lands in Utah. The federal government implemented a "roadless rule" which has resulted in the closure of roads that had been used for fuels reduction, logging, grazing, and other public lands management efforts.
