## **State Impact**

It is estimated that provisions to become in force beginning July 1, 2003 can be implemented with existing resources. The State will receive \$1,800 in Dedicated Credits beginning in FY 2003. Provisions to become in force beginning January 1, 2007 will be revenue neutral. Department of Natural Resources and Driver Licensing will receive fees to offset costs of developing and providing the approved motorboat safety course and endorsement. The costs and fees have yet to be determined.

## **Individual and Business Impact**

Boat livery businesses will pay a \$25 annual registration fee. It is estimated that this fee will generate \$1,800 in Dedicated Credits Revenue beginning FY 2003. Motorboat operators will be required to have passed an approved motorboat safety course and possess a valid driver's license with a motorboat endorsement on January 1, 2007 or thereafter to legally operate a motorboat on Utah's waterways. Temporary permits will be available for compliant nonresidents. The fees are intended to offset agencies' costs and have yet to be determined.
