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## **State Impact**

This bill appropriates \$3,200,000 from the Statewide Unified E-911 Emergency Service Fund to the Utah 911 Committee. Funding is intended to be on-going but not necessarily at the same amount. The bill also appropriates \$250,000 from the Statewide Unified E-911 Emergency Service Fund for FY 04 to the Automated Geographic Reference Center in the Division of Information Technology Services. The \$0.14 fee per line (conventional and wireless) state tax will generate \$3,575,600 in eleven months of collection of FY 05. The State Tax Commission is allowed to charge up to 1.5% administrative fee to cover costs. The \$0.14 state tax is reduced to \$0.08 in FY 07. The bill increases the cap from \$0.53 to \$0.65 that local governments are allowed to tax the same lines. If local governments increase taxes to the new cap, they will generate \$3,065,000 for the same 11 month year (collections lag one month).
