

**State Impact**

This bill requires the Department of Health and the Utah Solid and Hazardous Waste Control Board within the Department of Environmental Quality to establish decontamination and sampling standards for the testing of buildings determined to be contaminated. It is estimated that 1.5 FTE will be needed at the Department of Environmental Quality in FY 2005 to prepare rules and testing materials to certify decontamination contractors. This process is estimated to cost \$109,000 from Federal Funds. The bill also allows certification fees to be established. It is estimated that \$7,500 in Dedicated Credits will be collected annually for contractor certification.
