State Impact

It is estimated that any fiscal impact to implement provisions of this bill can be handled within existing budgets. The bill provides for a tax to be collected on radioactive wastes having a higher radionuclide concentration than wastes currently allowed. It is estimated that \$28,800 in increased revenues to the Uniform School Fund could be expected if higher radionuclide concentrations area licensed.
