## **State Impact**

Provisions of this bill will increase state revenues by \$1,600,000 in FY 2007 and \$880,000 in FY 2009 and every two years thereafter in renewal fees. The Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL) will require an appropriation of \$465,800 from the Commerce Service Fund in FY 2007 and \$296,300 beginning in FY 2008 and each fiscal year thereafter. The division will require 4 additional FTEs to implement provisions of the bill.

## **Individual and Business Impact**

Retail distributors in the state will be required to become licensed at a cost of \$210 for distributor licenses and \$110 for purchaser licenses. Distributors and purchasers will also be required to maintain and report transactions records to the division and make store space modifications to adhere to provisions of the bill.
