SHORT TITLE: Dentist Practice Act Amendments

STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Enactment of this bill would increase revenue to the Commerce Service Fund by \$1,000 in FY 2013 and by \$1,600 in FY 2014. Costs to the Commerce Department for implementation of the provisions of the bill would be \$2,000 ongoing from the Commerce Service Fund and \$400 one-time in FY 2013. Spending from the Commerce Service Fund affects annual transfers to the General Fund.

LOCAL GOVERNMENTS (UCA 36-12-13(2)(c))

Enactment of this bill likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

DIRECT EXPENDITURES BY UTAH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES (UCA 36-12-13(2)(d))

An estimated 10 individuals will apply for licenses annually at a cost of \$100 each. Cumulative cost for the licenses is estimated at \$1,000. It is also estimated that 10 individuals will apply for renewal licenses beginning in year two at \$63 per renewal for a cumulative cost of approximately \$600.
