DIRECT EXPENDITURES BY UTAH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES (UCA 36-12-13(2)(d))

Businesses could get a credit of up to \$2,000 in a fiscal year for each homeless individual hired. In year one it is expected that approximately 144 individuals would be hired for a cumulative credit of \$215,000. In year two approximately 287 individuals are expected to be hired for a cumulative total of \$431,000.
