SHORT TITLE: Warrant Process Amendments

SPONSOR: Jenkins, S. 2012 GENERAL SESSION

STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Enactment of this bill will increase state restricted fund revenues by \$686,300 beginning FY 2013. The bill will cost the Department of Public Safety one-time restricted funds of \$20,900 in FY 2013 and \$75,200 ongoing restricted funds beginning FY 2013. The bill will also cost the Department of Public Safety \$78,700 one-time (FY 2013) and \$1,154,000 ongoing (beginning 2013) from the General Fund. The bill will cost the Division of Wildlife Resources \$97,000 ongoing restricted funds beginning FY 2013.
