## STATE GOVERNMENT (UCA 36-12-13(2)(b))

Costs to the Commerce Department for implementation of the provisions of the bill would be \$6,800 annually from the Commerce Service Fund. Spending from the Commerce Service Fund affects annual transfers to the General Fund.

## LOCAL GOVERNMENTS (UCA 36-12-13(2)(c))

Enactment of this bill likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

## DIRECT EXPENDITURES BY UTAH RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES (UCA 36-12-13(2)(d))

Businesses offering continuing education courses could see increased revenue from the required courses. There are about 6,200 massage therapists who would be required to pay the cost for the courses in order to obtain the 24 hours of continuing education authorized in the bill.
