Enacting this bill could reduce revenue to the Department of Health by \$290,300; the Department of Human Services \$238,400; the Department of Public Safety \$497,600; the Governor's Office \$954,200; and the Courts \$139,900; as criminal surcharge funding is diverted to local governments.
