Enactment of this bill could increase revenues to the Department of Public Safety from dedicated credits and pass through funds by \$494,900 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 from additional background check charges. The bill also gives the Department of Human Services the option to assess an additional \$5 fee. Implementing this \$5 fee could generate additional income of \$85,500 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 to be deposited in the General Fund.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Human Services \$54,600 ongoing from the General Fund and \$1,500 one-time from the General Fund beginning in FY 2016 and cost the Department of Public Safety \$50,000 ongoing from dedicated credits and \$158,700 ongoing from pass through funds beginning in FY 2016 for increased background checks required by this bill. The bill also gives the Office of Licensing within the Department of Human Services the option to assess an additional \$5 fee. If the Office were to assess that fee, it could cost the Division of Child and Family Services in the Department of Human Services an additional \$4,700 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 from the General Fund for background checks on foster parents and other providers.

Enactment of this bill could cost individual businesses affected by the bill's background check requirements \$561,700 ongoing beginning in FY 2016. The bill also gives the Department of Human Services the option to assess an additional \$5 fee. Implementing this \$5 fee could cost individual businesses an additional \$80,800 ongoing beginning in FY 2016.

## **Notes on Notes**

The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
