Enactment of this legislation likely will result in additional revenues to the Water Commissioner Fund: \$11,500 in FY 2016 and \$23,000 ongoing in FY 2017.

Enactment of this legislation classifies water commissioners as state employees, which likely will cost the Division of Water Rights \$11,500 in FY 2016 and \$23,000 ongoing in FY 2017 from the Water Commissioner Fund. Costs would be for services provided by the Division of Risk Management, the Department of Human Resource Management, and the Department of Technology Services, and will be recouped from new charges for water commissioners.

## Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation classifies water commissioners as state employees, which likely will result in additional costs to some water users who have hired water commissioners. The actual amounts vary based on the specific circumstances of each water commissioner. The total state-wide impact is estimated to be \$11,500 in FY 2016 and \$23,000 ongoing in FY 2017.
