Enactment of this legislation could reduce year end transfers to the General Fund by \$31,600 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 and by \$15,000 one-time in FY 2016.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation allows a building owner to require a local building inspector to physically inspect the building to determine if it meets earthquake safe building standards. Local governments could incur costs associated with the inspections.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable expenditures by Utah residents or businesses.

Notes on Notes
