As preliminary FY 2016 URS contribution rates exceed the actuarially determined rate by more than the increase required by this bill, this legislation will not likely impact retirement rates paid by employers. Enactment of this legislation could increase costs to local governments by approximately \$548,000 per year for survivor health care benefits.
