State Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this bill could increase revenue to the Professional Practices Restricted Subfund by \$385,000 each year. Revenue would be generated from an increase in licensing fees paid by applicants. It is estimated that current fees at \$40 would increase by about \$26. This change may affect approximately 15,000 applicants per year.

Enactment of this bill may cost the State Board of Education \$385,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 from the Professional Practices Restricted Subfund due to anticipated increases in the number of cases resulting in mandatory permanent license revocations and hearings. Costs would be for the Utah Professional Practices Advisory Commission (UPPAC) to hire additional FTEs and expenses related to hearings and hearing officers.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

Enactment of this bill may increase licensing fees for applicants by about \$26 per applicant. It is estimated that 15,000 applicants may be subject to this fee annually for a net effect of \$385,000.
