Enactment of this legislation authorizes the Department of Public Safety (DPS) to use up to an additional \$400,000 from the DPS Restricted Account toward construction of the Driver License Building in Vernal. Enactment of this legislation authorizes the State Building Ownership Authority to issue revenue bonds of up to \$91,383,900 (plus direct issue costs) for the Fourth District Courthouse in Provo and a liquor store in West Valley. Enactment of this legislation authorizes the Board of Regents to issue revenue bonds of up to \$111,100,000 (plus direct issue costs) for design and construction of buildings using non-state institutional or agency funds or donations at the University of Utah, Utah State University, and Dixie State University.
