This bill could cost state agencies and higher education \$1,622,300 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 for higher price new or replacement vehicles. These costs are in the following areas: 1. Board of Regents - \$1,566,300 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 from the General Fund 2. State Board of Education - \$56,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 from the Education Fund Entities could encounter additional costs associated with expanding the infrastructure for CNG filling stations.
