Enactment of this legislation would create the Data Security Management Council with nine members including one legislator who could receive compensation, and the Department of Technology Services would staff the Council. Enactment of this legislation could cost the Legislature up to \$4,600 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 from the General Fund for compensation for the legislator appointed to the council, and it could cost the Department of Technology Services up to \$2,600 ongoing beginning in FY 2016 from the General Fund for staff services.
