Goal

Title: Enhanced visitor satisfaction will be measured by analyzing increasing park usage. The best way to measure usage is through financial performance.

Description: There are two targets for this goal, both of which are tied to financial performance. The first measure is to have revenue exceed expenses. The second measure is increasing profitability over time. Success is having more people visit the park more often and the financial targets will show whether or not we meet the goal.

Collection Method: Revenue and expense reports are prepared monthly and will be used to measure success.
