Enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health \$20,000 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2017 to pay for staff time for the State School Nurse Consultant and training materials to develop and implement the annual training for school employee volunteers. The Department of Health has indicated it can absorb \$9,000 of these costs within existing resources.
