New Services or Benefit

Public Benefit:

Purpose: The purpose is to create a web portal that allows a person doing business in the state to access, at a single point of entry, all relevant state-collected business data about the person.

Services: The services provided by the funding increase are 2 FTEs to develop the initial design and prototype of the Single Sign-on Database and to get business requirements from other agencies.

Expected Outcome: The expected outcome is to design and create a prototype for a web portal that allows a person doing business in the state to access, at a single point of entry, all relevant state-collected business data about the person. This will result in efficiencies for businesses.

Implementations and Resources: The bill will be implemented by coordination with participating entities to ensure all business requirements are met.

How: The proposed activities will provide one place for a Utah business to conduct all business with the state.

Performance Measures

Goal

Title: Develop Baseline

Description: Baseline data, so accurate data is available for comparison with the new system.
Potential items to be included: Current systems used by participating entities; Identifiers in each system; Number of businesses enrolled in each system; Number of transactions processed; Number of unique visits; Dollar value of transactions processed; Cost per transaction of transactions processed.

Collection Method: The 2 FTEs will collect data from current systems used by the participating entities.

Goal

Title: Report on progress to PUT

Description: Report on progress to PUT no later than November 30, 2016, with an initial description of progress in creating the business database and the single sign-on web portal, and report no later than November 30, 2017, regarding the development of the business database and the single sign-on web portal, including any remaining obstacles.

Collection Method: The report will include detailed information relating to meetings held with stakeholders, status of development of project, and dollars spent.
