Enactment of this legislation could increase restricted revenues to the new Children with Cancer Support Restricted Account in the amount of \$12,500 annually beginning in October, 2016 (FY 2017), from a \$25 special group license plate annual fee for approximately 500 Utah residents. If license plate production start-up costs are covered by private donations, the Tax Commission would receive \$7,500 in dedicated credits revenue, assuming 500 three-color plates are ordered.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Department of Health \$12,500 annually beginning in October of FY 2017 from the Children with Cancer Support Restricted Account, in the form of pass-throughs to non-profit hospitals that apply and are awarded grants. Expenditures from this account are contingent on the amount of revenue collected into the account. If license plate production start-up costs are covered by private donation, dedicated credits expenditures for the Tax Commission could be \$7,500, assuming 500 three-color plates are ordered.

Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

Enactment of this legislation could support the availability of additional funds for certain non-profit hospitals, for a total of \$12,500 annually if 500 plates are ordered. Individuals choosing to purchase these special group license plates would spend \$25 annually at the time of registration, in addition to applicable license plate fees.
