Enactment of this legislation appropriates \$9,500 ongoing from the General Fund to the newly created General Fund Restricted - National Guard Death Benefit Account beginning in FY 2017.

Enactment of this legislation appropriates \$9,500 ongoing from the General Fund to the newly created General Fund Restricted - National Guard Death Benefit Account beginning in FY 2017. Any additional fiscal impact associated with this bill would depend on the unpredictable factor of deaths while on state active duty. Enactment of this bill would cost the Utah National Guard \$100,000 from the General Fund Restricted - National Guard Death Benefit Account, one-time for each death of a Utah National Guard member who died while on state active duty.
