Enactment of this legislation would likely reduce the General Fund revenues due to the elimination of the requirement for beekeepers to pay the annual registration fee. The projected revenue reduction is \$19,000, and is based on the assumption that most of the hobbyists beekeepers, which represent 98% of all beekeepers in Utah, would no longer register.
