UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this legislation could decrease revenue to the Transportation Fund by \$16,800 in FY 2017 and by \$33,500 beginning in FY 2018, by eliminating a \$5 recognition special group license plate fee for "In God We Trust" license plates for 6,700 individuals annually beginning January 1, 2017.

Enactment of this legislation could cost the Tax Commission \$100,000 from the General Fund one-time in FY 2017, to produce 25,000 "In God We Trust" standard issue license plates to meet initial demand.

Individuals that wish to have an "In God We Trust" license plate would save \$5 from the elimination of the recognition special group fee. They would still be required to pay the standard \$5 fee.
