UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this bill allows tow truck operators, tow truck motor carriers, and impound yards to charge a credit card processing fee in an amount equal to the lesser of the actual cost to process the credit card or three percent of the transaction total. A typical one day non-consent tow is \$215. When using the three percent of the transaction total, businesses may receive an additional \$6.45 per transaction. Subsequently, individuals may pay \$6.45 more per typical one day non-consent transaction. The annual estimate for one day non-consent tows is approximately 50,000, meaning a net impact of \$322,500 annually to businesses and individuals. The actual amount will vary based on the actual number of tows, additional fees based on storage or location, actual costs to process credit cards, etc.

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget.
