Enactment of this legislation would allow an estimated 2070 veterans with a certain level of disability to save \$75 (\$35 for senior citizens) each per year on state parks annual pass for a total annual savings of \$113,000. The estimated total number of Utah veterans that would qualify is approximately 11,000; so 8,930 additional veterans could forgo paying up to \$537,000 per year in park fees.

## **Notes on Notes**
