Enactment of this legislation likely will impact state revenue by reducing federal funding in the amount of \$36,000.

State expenses would be impacted by removing the requisite to have Family Employment Program applicants complete a questionnaire requiring drug testing for those determined likely, based upon the questionnaire, to have a substance use disorder. Enactment of this legislation would create a savings of \$36,000 in federal funds by eliminating the initial questionnaire (\$6,000) and any follow up drug testing (\$30,000).
