UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this bill could shift up to \$6 million in sales tax revenue from local transit budgets to counties and cities budgets in certain non-UTA counties. Those counties include Tooele, Box Elder, Cache, Duchesne, Iron, Summit, Uintah, and Washington Counties. Additionally, enactment of this bill could increase local sales tax revenue by \$104.3 million in FY 2018 if all eligible entities adopt the local option sales tax. Of the total potential revenue generated, \$83.4 million would be distributed to cities and towns and the remaining \$20.9 million would be distributed to the counties.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Consumers in counties that choose to impose this new local option sales and use tax, could pay an extra 0.25% in sales tax. A family of four earning \$50,000 per year that spends approximately \$20,000 per year on taxable items would expect to see an increase in sales tax of \$50 per year.
