UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this bill could reduce the year-end transfers to the General Fund by \$1,000 in FY 2017 and by \$800 in FY 2018.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Commerce \$1,300 annually to administer and monitor the licenses. The Department of Commerce will also collect \$200 in dedicated credit revenue annually for background checks. Spending from the Commerce Service Fund impacts year end transfers to the General Fund.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this bill could result in 5 applicants paying a \$50 initial license fee in FY 2017 and a \$32 renewal fee in FY 2018. An additional 5 applicants could apply for the license in FY 2018. Applicants will also pay a \$40 background check fee. Aggregate costs for applicants would be approximately \$500 in FY 2017 and \$700 in FY 2018.

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
