Enactment of this bill could cost the Courts \$341,400 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2017 for one judge and one clerk. To the extent that an additional attorney from the Office of the Attorney General is required to provide legal representation for those involved in juvenile-related cases with the addition of a new juvenile court judge, costs for the Office of the Attorney General could increase by \$177,000 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2017.
