Enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Health \$41,000 ongoing for personnel (0.5 FTE) to maintain the online education module and \$25,300 one-time to develop the website through which the online education module will be delivered, all from the General Fund beginning in FY 2017. The Department of Health has indicated it can absorb these costs within existing resources.

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation may reduce revenue for local health departments statewide by approximately \$73,000 annually as the immunization exemption form must be made available free of charge to the public.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation may save about 3,500 individuals up to \$25 each which is the typical fee charged by Utah local health departments for an immunization exemption, representing a fee savings statewide of \$73,000 annually.
