State Government

Enactment of this legislation would reduce annual year end transfers to the General Fund from the Commerce Service Account by \$1,500 ongoing beginning in FY 2017 and by \$2,400 one-time in FY 2017.

The State of Utah may see an increase per covered member with health insurance of \$0.04 due to increased utilization of opiate antagonists. The ongoing costs to the State beginning in FY 2017 may be about \$1,300 in state funds (\$2,400 total funds). Additionally, enactment of this legislation may cost the Department of Commerce''s Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing \$1,500 ongoing beginning in FY 2017 and one-time costs of \$2,400 in FY 2017 from the Commerce Service Account to develop a protocol for standing prescription drug orders for an opiate antagonist and increased investigations to ensure compliance.

Notes on Notes
