Local Government

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct, measurable costs for local governments.

Individuals & Businesses

Enactment of this bill limits a monthly interconnection fee to no more than \$2 for net metering ratepayers who do not elect cash payments authorized in the bill, and allows a monthly interconnection fee exceeding \$2 for those who elect cash payments. The impact on customers and independent energy producers cannot be quantified at this time since we do not know how many customers will elect each option.

Notes on Notes
