Enactment of this legislation could increase revenue to the General Fund by approximately \$25,600 in FY 2017 and \$18,400 beginning in FY 2018, from license fees paid by online and small manufacturer dealers and salespersons.

## Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Online and small manufacturer dealers and salespersons would be required to obtain a license and pay the requisite fee. Approximately 74 dealers could pay an annual license fee of \$127; approximately 289 salespersons could pay an initial license fee of \$56 and an annual renewal fee of \$31.

## **Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
