Enactment of this legislation could cost the State Board of Education \$50,000 from the Education Fund one-time in FY 2017 to hire a contractor to develop a school resource officer training curriculum and provide initial training to officers and school principals. This cost estimate includes research, curriculum development, pilot testing, and five regional trainings. Additional costs could result if the State Board of Education or another state agency provides additional trainings.
