If this legislation passes, state expenditures will be impacted by the Division of Child and Family Services establishing a psychotropic medication pilot program consisting of an oversight team for children in foster care at a cost of \$340,500 General Fund and \$332,200 federal funds ongoing beginning in FY 2017 and \$20,000 (\$18,200 General Fund and \$1,200 federal funds) one-time in FY 2017. State expenditures will also be impacted by an increase for preparation and court time necessary due to the legislation for the Office of the Attorney General (\$68,000 General Fund) and the Guardian ad Litem (\$45,600 General Fund) ongoing beginning in FY 2017.
