Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

By classifying a project coming off of a redevelopment agency as new growth, this bill may increase revenue to local taxing entities by an estimated \$60 million in 2017 and \$14 million in 2018.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

By classifying a project coming off of a redevelopment agency as new growth, this bill may result in businesses and individuals not seeing what otherwise would have been a tax rate reduction, equating to an estimated \$60 million in 2017 and \$14 million in 2018.

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
