UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

Enactment of this legislation may decrease state revenue by a total of \$270,000 annually (\$27,700 from restricted funds and \$242,300 from the General Fund) beginning in FY 2017 due to a decrease in filing fees collected by district courts as approximately 750 cases at a filing fee of \$360 per case may be filed in small claims court rather than district court.

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Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation may result in an increase in revenue for local government by about \$138,800 annually beginning in FY 2017 with approximately 750 additional cases filed each year in small claims court at a filing fee of \$185 per case.

Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation may save individuals \$175 in filing fees per case. With approximately 750 cases, the total statewide savings is \$131,300.
