Enactment of this bill could cost the Department of Human Services about \$648,400 from the General Fund in FY 2018 and \$641,100 in FY 2018 for an estimated 1,780 home studies (equating to 5,232 interviews) assuming 4 hours/interview. Also, this could cost \$70,400 in FY 2018 and \$69,600 in FY 2019 in federal funds.
