Enactment of this bill may cost the Department of Health \$29,100 from the General Fund and \$29,100 from federal funds both one-time in FY 2017 for computer programming costs and staff time to create the new program"s policies and \$1,250,000 from the General Fund and \$2,900,000 from federal funds both ongoing beginning in FY 2018 to provide mental health benefits and services to 8,400 postpartum women. Additionally, this bill may cost the Department of Workforce Services \$10,500 from the General Fund and \$94,400 from federal funds both one-time in FY 2017 and \$5,800 from the General Fund and \$15,500 from federal funds both ongoing beginning in FY 2018 for programming costs and information system maintenance.
