Local Government UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation may cost local education agencies an additional \$10,000 to \$15,000 per bus to purchase a bus with seatbelts. In total, larger school districts will incur an additional \$30,000 to \$75,000 annually on average for their typical replacement of three to five buses each year. Depending on the configuration of buses, seatbelts, and ridership, this legislation may result in a decrease in the overall capacity of school buses which may over time increase the number of school buses a local education agency must purchase.
