Purpose: To serve the general public to let them know information about felony child abuse offenders

Services: Build a website and team that will network with 130 lawenforcement agencies and department of Corrections to monitor information and present information about felony child abuse offenders

Expected Outcome: To inform public of felony child abuse offenders according to the proposed bill

Implementations and Resources: This program will be implemented to resemble it's State agency counterpart, the sex offender registry. We will anticipate listing all felony child abusers on the registry within the first year and then keep the information up to date on an on-going basis. The fiscal note requests resources to support this new program which will track and monitor the information for all the state's felony child abuse offenders. Resources will be used to fund a team to collect data and follow up with offenders, a couple supervisors, a program administrator, as well as a couple trainers who will be needed to coordinate with the 130 law enforecement agencies statewide as well as adult probation and parole.

How: The agency will list all felony child abusers who are required to register with the website and follow up with them to make sure the information is kept up to date.
