Enactment of this legislation may cost \$186,600 one-time in FY 2018 and \$20,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2018 from the Education Fund to the State Board of Education to administer a kindergarten supplemental enrichment grant program. In addition, the bill may cost \$2,880,000 ongoing from the Education Fund beginning in FY 2018 for grants to schools for kindergarten supplemental enrichment programs. There is a possibility that the \$2,880,000 for grants to schools could be funded with Temporary Assistance for Needy Families reserve funding.

This bill allows qualifying public schools to receive grants administered by the State Board of Education for kindergarten supplement enrichment programs. With an estimated 64 eligible schools and \$45,000 per school, in total, schools may receive up to \$2,880,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2018 in grant money.
