Enactment of this legislation could cost the institutions in the Utah System of Higher Education \$228,000 ongoing from the Education Fund beginning in FY 2018 for personnel at the institutions to provide the required information to students. Enactment of this legislation could also cost those institutions approximately \$100,000 from the Education Fund for one-time programming costs systemwide.
